“ Tony was a beautiful person, and my husband and I always enjoyed talking to him around Cresskill High School soccer games. We did not get to see him as much last year, but he did make it to some of the games, and it was great to see him there.

I wanted to share a strange thing that happened yesterday (9/8/20) on the day of Tony's Visitation. I received a new mail notification on my phone, so I went to check my mail. I saw an old 2014 email from the Director of Boy's coaching of a soccer club that my son used to play for, followed by a string of emails from my father, who had passed away on 9/10/2016.

I found it very strange and wondered if I had put in a search word that generated these particular emails. I checked, and I hadn't. These were the "current" emails. All of a sudden, my phone started downloading all of my other emails, 7000+ of them. I immediately wrote to my relatives that my father was reaching out to me before the 4th anniversary of his death, but I was still puzzled as to why the first email was from that soccer club. I went back to the email app, and the downloading number was now out of 5232 emails (I think, in case that particular number was significant to anyone.)

Later in the day, as I got ready to go to Tony's viewing, it suddenly dawned on me that Tony's grandsons, Luca Antonia and Gianpaolo, also played for that same soccer club for many years as well.

I have the warm feeling that Tony met my father in heaven, and they were both letting me know this. They were wonderful men, and I am comforted by their newfound friendship.

Rest in peace, Tony. I will especially be thinking of you whenever I am at the Cresskill HS soccer field. Our deepest condolences to all of you who loved him.
